Mayoral and County elections: 1 May 2025

Elections will be held on Thursday 1 May 2025 to elect the first mayor for the Greater Lincolnshire Combined County Authority and several Lincolnshire County Councillors.

The new mayoral position for the <u>Greater Lincolnshire Combined County Authority</u> will oversee the use of funds and powers devolved to the area by Government.

The elections for Lincolnshire County Council will see 11 County Councillors elected to the 11 County Electoral Divisions across North Kesteven.

Here are some of the key dates you should be aware of:

Nominations for the Lincolnshire County Council elections opened on Wednesday March 19, and for the mayoral election began on Thursday March 20. For details of becoming a candidate in either election, see: n-kesteven.gov.uk/elections2025.

The nomination deadline for paper submissions is **4pm on Wednesday April 2**. Statements of persons nominated will be published on Thursday April 3. See: <u>n-kesteven.gov.uk/elections2025</u>

You must be registered to vote, if eligible. **The deadline to do this is midnight on Friday April 11**. Visit the UK website to register.

To vote in person at a polling station you must show an accepted form of photo ID. See the full list of <u>accepted ID types here</u>. This now includes (from May 1) the HM Armed Forces Veteran Card (MoD Form 100).

The deadline to apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate for use at elections, if you need one, is 5pm on Wednesday April 23, and you can apply here.

New car park for Sleaford

A new car park to be created on Sleaford's derelict ambulance station site will offer additional free and low-cost parking under a principle agreed by district councillors.

Fund to support VE Day community celebration *

A fund is being made available to support the North Kesteven community in celebrating and commemorating the 80th anniversaries of VE and VJ Days.

Community and voluntary groups, charities and social enterprises with financial resources below £10,000 can apply for a grant of up to £500 each to deliver local events relating to VE or VJ Day that benefit communities.

Although Victory in Europe (VE) Day on May 8 falls on a Thursday, there is a national push for the preceding Bank Holiday Monday on May 5 to be a focus for community activity and a national programme of events spanning the four days from May 5 to 8. Victory in Japan (VJ) Day on August 15 marks the ultimate end of the Second World War. It falls on a Friday in the summer holidays, making the weekend an ideal opportunity for festivities.

This fund will close for applications for VE Day events on April 14 and July 21 for VJ Day events. Early application is advised to avoid disappointment. Visit our Funding webpage for eligibility criteria and an application form.

Funded activity must take place within a week either side of May 8 or August 15 and be of benefit to North Kesteven residents.
